Green FAQ: Cotton Vs. Other Types of Bags

Q: "Are cotton bags more environmentally friendly than plastic bags?"

A: No, cotton bags can be much more harmful to the environment if factors such as the water used to produce the cotton are taken into account. Adding to previous research, a 2018 [Danish life-cycle assessment](#) of common types of carrier bags found that a cotton bag would need to be reused thousands of times more than a plastic bag to equal its environmental performance.

The study excluded the effects of marine litter since it was regarded as a negligible factor in Denmark (similar to other countries with well-managed waste systems). The study ultimately showed that other types of bags, e.g. paper and non-woven PP plastic carriers, were more eco-friendly than cotton bags.

Therefore, if you need to source carrier bags, e.g. for an event, it may be greener not to use cotton.
