

Entry Requirements

To help you gain maximum benefits from the programme, you should have a Bachelor's degree from a recognised university, either in English Language Studies, Linguistics or in a relevant field (with evidence of adequate knowledge in language studies). Teaching qualifications and teaching experience, while preferred, are not required for admission.

International applicants whose first language is not English are required to submit an official Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score. These tests dates must be no more than two years before the date of application.

Applications may be made online. Hard copies of all supporting documents must be submitted within one week from the date of successful online submission.
